Our month-long stay in OR. was filled with giggling grandchildren, painting, dog tricks, car repairs, reading bedtime stories, visiting old friends, eating new recipes, throwing balls, household chores, watching new family traditions in the making, singing all together in the car, celebrating VBS with our grandkids, Toys-R-Us trips, Dairy Queen-chocolate dip cone, worshipping alongside our daughter at her church, laughing at old home movies and on and on! We spent 1 week at a friend's beach house in Waldport. A very meaningful moment was when we were able to present our daughters with "thank you" gifts for all the sacrifices they had made down through the years to be "pastor's kids." Tears were shed. We love you Aubrey, Jamie and Sarah.

ALASKA/CALIFORNIA – To top off our month away, Werner traveled with college buddies to the Kenai Peninsula of Alaska. These "4EVER" FRIENDS, as they call themselves, have been adventuring together, every other year, for the past eight years. This year the family of one of the fellas hosted and provided a fishing adventure for the group. A highlight was having humpback whales surface and spout 35 feet from the boat! Fishing for halibut /salmon, hiking, laughing, sharing, praying, kayaking, wildlife spotting, all surrounded by God's majestic creation (second only to Montana's beauty, of course) was perfect. Not to be outdone, Debbie spent this time in Southern California with our eldest daughter (Aubrey) and her husband (Travis). She reports that our two new "grand-doggies" are the smartest & cutest in the world!
